#### A New Language!

Learning a new language is exciting, challenging, intimidating and rewarding; so many conflicting emotions and outcomes!

Many years ago while teaching a group of adults, a student came to class excited about a book he had discovered.... "Italian in 10 Minutes a Day". I quickly pointed out that the sub-title had been omitted... and I added.... "Every Day for the Rest of Your Life".

Everyone learns at a different pace. That is normal; but one must also approach learning differently. Some learn better by listening (auditory learners). Others, (visual learners) are more comfortable with a written script, but listening is still the best method, even for them. The more you listen, the more you practice what you hear, the better you learn. Didn't we learn English, or another "first" language, by listening and modeling what we heard? We didn't first learn to read and write. There is a rhythm to language which we need to hear, to imitate; and sometimes the written word impedes it. While reading we will naturally rely on the pronunciation of our native language, which may have a different rhythm and cadence. Listen first...as many times as necessary, afterwards, proceed to a written script if you must!

Then there is the false concept of "translation" which traps many students. Rarely can we convert a sentence correctly by thinking first in English, yet this tendency comes naturally. We use it as our comfort zone. It is more beneficial to follow a "we say..., they say...." process rather than trying to fit a round peg into a square hole. Listen to what "they say" and use it! Don't let English interfere! This takes time, practice and perseverance, but the rewards are great.

Remember ...."10 Minutes a Day...for the rest of Your Life"!

## SERGEANT JOHN BASILONE MEMORIAL GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships valued at \$3,000, each paid out over two years at \$1,500 per year. The awardees must be initiating graduate study, full-time, at an accredited campus based college/university program in the United States. A candidate must be a United States citizen of Italian descent.

## BERNARD AND CAROLYN TORRACO MEMORIAL NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS

The UNICO Foundation will provide up to ten grants, valued at \$2,500 each, paid on award, to students attending accredited prelicensure or graduate nursing programs in the United States. Consideration is given to applicants demonstrating financial need. A candidate must be a United States citizen. This program is open to nursing students of all ethnicities.

### RALPH J. TORRACO FINE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships, valued at \$2,500 each, to students currently attending, full-time, an accredited, campus based college/university program in the United States pursuing a degree in the Fine Arts. A nominee must hold United States citizenship. This program is open to applicants of all ethnicities.

#### **INSERRA SCHOLARSHIPS**

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships valued at \$2,500 each to students currently attending, full time, an accredited campus based college/university in the United States pursuing a degree. A candidate must be an American citizen of Italian descent.

## ALPHONSE A. MIELE SCHOLARSHIP MAJOR DON S. GENTILE SCHOLARSHIP WILLIAM C. DAVINI SCHOLARSHIP THEODORE MAZZA SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant four scholarships valued at \$6,000 to high school seniors who will be attending, full-time, an accredited campus based college/university program in the United States; paid out at \$1,500 per school year up to a maximum of 4 years. A candidate must be a United States citizen of Italian descent. Candidates are encouraged to apply for all four scholarships.

#### ELEANOR AND ANTHONY DE FRANCIS SCHOLARSHIP FUND FOR NATURAL SCIENCES

#### California Institute of Technology Massachusetts Institute of Technology The School of Astronomical Studies at the University of Arizona, Tucson

UNICO Foundation will grant scholarships valued in the range of \$2,500 to \$10,000 to fully-matriculating students currently attending, full time, one of the above listed universities majoring in the Natural Sciences. The candidate must be at least eighteen years of age and a natural born United States citizen of Italian ancestry, having at least one parent of Italian descent.

## DIMATTIO CELLI FAMILY STUDY ABROAD SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships, valued at \$1,250 each, for study in Italy. Candidates must be currently attending, fulltime, an accredited college or university in the United States, pursuing a degree. The study abroad program must be eligible for credit by the student's college/university. An applicant must be a United States citizen of Italian descent.

## LOUISE TORRACO MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships, valued at \$2,500 each, to students currently attending, full-time, an accredited campus based college/university program in the United States pursuing study of the Physical Sciences or Life Sciences. A nominee must hold United States citizenship. This program is open to applicants of all ethnicities.

## DR. BENJAMIN COTTONE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant a \$5,000 scholarship, paid on award, to a student pursuing a medical doctor or doctor of osteopathy degree at an accredited medical school in the United States. A candidate must be a United States citizen of Italian descent.

## MARIA AND PAOLO ALESSIO SOUTHERN ITALY SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will provide a scholarship, valued at \$2,500 to a student currently attending, full-time, an accredited campus based college/university program in the United States pursuing a degree.

An applicant must be a United States citizen of Southern Italian descent, specifically including the regions of:
Abruzzo, Basilicata, Campania, Calabria, Latium, Molise, Puglia, Sardinia, Sicilia.

#### RALPH J. TORRACO SCHOLARSHIP

The UNICO Foundation will grant two scholarships, valued at \$2,500 each, to students currently attending, full-time, an accredited campus based college/university program in the United States pursuing a degree. A nominee must hold United States citizenship. This program is open to applicants of all ethnicities.

The UNICO Foundation will provide a scholarship, valued at \$1,000, to a student enrolled full-time, in an accredited college/university program in the United States pursuing Italian Studies. A candidate must hold United States citizenship. This program is open to applicants of all ethnicities.

#### SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION **REQUIREMENTS**

A nominee must reside in the home state of an active UNICO unless otherwise Chapter, indicated. Candidates MUST meet the eligibility requirements stated on each of the respective applications. Applications are to be submitted online. Potential candidates are directed to the UNICO National website (www. unico.org), where they will click on the Scholarship tab. Students will find complete information and submission instructions. Paper applications cannot be accepted.

Anyone requiring assistance is encouraged to contact a member of the Scholarship Committee or the National Office.

PLEASE NOTE: The deadline to complete applications is March 1 for the DiMattio Celli; April 15 for all other **programs.** There can be no exceptions.

In the past, some Chapters have used the National application form for local scholarships. Since the online procedure does not allow Chapter access, we have posted an application template on the Members Section of our website. This model can be edited to meet Chapter requirements.

Andrew "Andy" E. Bertone, former Mayor of Rutherford, passed away quietly on Sunday, December 16, 2018, surrounded by his children. He was 91 years old. Andy will be remembered as a loving husband to his late wife, Pauline (nee LiCalsi) of 57 years, father, grandfather, public servant, Rutherford Councilman and Mayor, WWII veteran, and friend to many in his beloved town of Rutherford where he resided for 61 years. Andrew is survived by his children, Pamela Steele and husband Robert, Cynthia

Frazier, Andrew and wife Mary Kate, Mary Alice Rogoff and husband Marc, and Lisa Wheeler and husband Brian, along with 11 grandchildren, Kristina Evans and husband Christopher, Anthony Steele, Greyson, Cole, and Jordan Frazier, Bridget and Nicholas Bertone, Michelle, Shayna, and Martin Rogoff, and Nina-Marie Wheeler.

Andrew was born and raised in Jersey City, son of Anthony Bertone and Dellora (née Silvestri) Bertone of Jersey City and North Bergen. During World War II, he enlisted in the Navy at age 17 and saw active duty in the South Pacific. After returning home, he attended Fairleigh Dickinson University where he graduated with a degree in Bachelor of Science, and began a 30-year career with the Mobil Oil Corporation in New York City as a Medical Technician and later as a toxicologist.

After his retirement from Mobil, he continued to work in the medical field, but he will be best remembered as someone who tirelessly served his community and spent countless hours volunteering for others.

He was a parishioner, lecturer and Eucharistic minister for St. Mary's Church of Rutherford for over 50 years. He was proud of his 30 years of service on the Rutherford town council. including two terms as Mayor of Rutherford from 1992 to 2000. As mayor, Andrew always commented on how he enjoyed helping people and officiating at weddings during his tenure. Volunteering was an important part of Andy's life, dedicating himself to many local committees and organizations, including over 50 years of volunteering for the Rutherford Community Blood Bank and the Rutherford Red Cross, in addition to decades of service to the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the CDC, The Rutherford Old Guard, Kip Center and, forever proud of his Italian heritage, he was instrumental in organizing, and was the President of, the Rutherford Chapter of UNICO, the largest Italian-American service organization in the country.

He will be always remembered and truly missed by his children, grandchildren and all who knew and worked with him.








#### In Memoriam

SAMUEL K. BEAMON SR. 1947 - 2018



Served in U.S. Marine Corps WATERBURY — Samuel K. Beamon Sr., 71, passed away peacefully on Sunday, Oct. 28, 2018, at Abbott Terrace after a long illness. Sam was born in Waterbury on July 27,1947, to the late Milton and Mary Louise (Wiggins) Beamon. He attended Waterbury schools including, Walsh Grammar, and graduated from Kaynor Technical High School. He was a member of the Waterbury Young Marines.

In 1965, Sam enlisted in the United States Marine Corps, and became a helicopter mechanic, crew chief and aerial gunner and was deployed to Vietnam. Sam flew in more than 360 combat air missions and received numerous awards, including 16 air medals, Combat Air Crew Wings, Combat Action Ribbon, Naval and Presidential Unit citations. After returning home, Sam

worked at Pratt & Whitney. In 1970, he joined the Waterbury Police Department and rose through its ranks to sergeant, detective and lieutenant. For 12 years he was in charge of the Juvenile Division and retired after 28 years of service. He was a trailblazer and leader within the department and assisted in breaking down racial barriers.

Sam was committed to improving the lives of veterans and senior citizens. He was an active member of many organizations and was a member of the Waterbury Board of Police Commissioners. Sam took pride in many service organizations that included the Marine Corps League, and was elected as state commandant; also American Legion Post 135, VFW Post 201 and the Waterbury Elks. He also was in Marine Corps associated programs including the Order of Devil Dogs, Pop-a-Smoke, and the HMM-262 Combat Helicopter Association, along with the Brass City Young Marines.

Sam loved the Marines and wrote a book on his experience, "Flying Death, The Vietnam Experience." His concern for veterans' issues led him to join the Waterbury Veterans Memorial Committee, where he served in various positions and became its chairman in 2014. Sam was always a fixture at veterans programs, parades and ceremonies. His community service was noteworthy as he was constantly invited to area schools to discuss citizenship, patriotism and service. Sam mentored many of our city's youth and served many years

on the Fifth District Congressional Review Committee for candidates for military service academies.

Sam was the recipient of many awards. He was named" Black Mayor for a Day." was inducted into the state of Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame, and also was the first Waterburian to receive the prestigious UNICO "John Basilone Freedom Award." He was a licensed pilot and professional photographer, and was an organizer and took pride in volunteering as operations director for his brother Reggie's successful State House campaigns.

Sam is survived by a son, Samuel Beamon Jr. (Vivian) of Mitchellsville, Md.; a daughter, Susan Shapiro of Waterbury; three brothers, Gregory, of Peabody, Mass., Reginald (Judith) and Milton, of Waterbury; and three grandchildren and numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, friends and a loving Waterbury community.

Samuel Beamon will be lying in state at the Veterans Memorial Hall, City Hall of Waterbury, 235 Grand St., Waterbury, from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. on Sunday for public visitation. A funeral service will be on Monday at 11 a.m. at Grace Baptist Church, 65 Kingsbury St., Waterbury. The family will be receiving friends from 10 a.m. until the time of the service at the church. Full military honors will be presented at New Pine Grove Cemetery, Waterbury, immediately following the funeral service. Interment will be at Arlington National Cemetery.

#### In Memoriam

MOST REVEREND ROBERT CHARLES MORLINO, D.D., S.T.D. 1946 – 2018



The Most Reverend Robert
Charles Morlino, age 71,
Bishop of the Diocese of
Madison, passed away on
Saturday, November 24, 2018
m in SSM St. Mary's Hospital,

at 9:15 pm in SSM St. Mary's Hospital, Madison, Wisconsin. He was born in Scranton, Pennsylvania, on December 31, 1946, to Charles and Albertina Morlino. He was raised in Lackawanna County, Pennsylvania, where he graduated from the Jesuit-run Scranton Preparatory High School. He entered the seminary for the Maryland Province of the Society of Jesus and was ordained to the priesthood for that Province on June 1, 1974. Father Morlino continued his studies at Fordham University, New York City, New York, where he earned a bachelor's degree in Philosophy; the University of Notre Dame, Notre Dame, Indiana, where he earned a Master's Degree in Philosophy; Weston School of Theology, Cambridge, Massachusetts, where he earned a Masters of Divinity, and the Pontifical Gregorian University, Rome, Italy, where he earned a Doctorate in Moral Theology with specialization in Fundamental Moral Theology and Bioethics.

Father Morlino became a priest

of the Diocese of Kalamazoo in 1981 where he served as Vicar for Spiritual Development; Executive Assistant and Theological Consultant to the Bishop; Moderator of the Curia, and as a Promoter of Justice in the Diocesan Tribunal. He served as administrator of numerous parishes and rector of St. Augustine Cathedral. He taught Philosophy at Loyola College in Baltimore, Maryland; St. Joseph University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; Boston College, Massachusetts, and the University of Notre Dame and St. Mary's College, Indiana. He served as an instructor in Continuing Education for Priests, Religious, and Laity and as Director of Parish Renewal Programs.

Father Morlino was scheduled to begin a full-time faculty appointment as Professor of Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit, Michigan, when Pope Saint John Paul II appointed him the Ninth Bishop of Helena on July 6, 1999. Four years later, Bishop Morlino was named the fourth Bishop of Madison on May 23, 2003. He was installed on August 1, 2003.

During his 44 plus years of ministry to the Catholic Church Universal, on the national level Bishop Morlino served as chairman of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee on the Diaconate and the Ad Hoc Committee on Health Care Issues and the Church. He also served on the USCCB Bishops' and Presidents' Committee, which seeks to encourage the Catholic identity of institutions of higher education.

Bishop Morlino served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of The National Catholic Bioethics Center (NCBC) which conducts research, consultation, publishing, and education to promote human dignity in health care and the life sciences. He also served as Chairman of the Board of Visitors for the Western Hemisphere Institute for Security Cooperation (WHINSEC). This board was a federal advisory committee created by the United States Congress to maintain independent re-

view, observation and recommendation regarding operations of the institute. In 2006, the national Alliance for Marriage joined with the Congress of Racial Equality to present Bishop Morlino with their Lifetime Achievement Award for his promotion of the fundamental rights of Freedom of Speech and Freedom of Religion. In 2008, for his work in defense of the dignity of the human person, Bishop Morlino was awarded Human Life International's Cardinal von Galen Award, named after the famous German bishop who worked actively against the Nazis. That same year, he also received the St. Edmund's Medal of Honor, awarded to Catholics who have used their God-given talents in promoting the common good. For his service to the United States of America and his promotion of human rights education, the bishop was honored by the Department of the Army in 2009. In 2015, he was the recipient of the Relevant Radio Christ Brings Hope Award and earlier this year, he received the St. Thomas Aquinas College Medallion.

As shepherd of the Diocese of Madison, Bishop Morlino's three expressed priorities were: to increase the number and quality of the men ordained to the diocesan priesthood; to instill a greater sense of reverence throughout the entire diocese, especially through our worship of God, celebrated in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, and to challenge Catholic institutions in the diocese to live out their professed faith in Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, through their ministry in the secular community.

He succeeded in accomplishing what he set out to do in the diocese by way of fostering greater priestly vocations (he ordained 40 men to the priesthood, with another 24 presently in formation), bringing a greater sense of reverent worship to the entire diocese, and by making significant inroads toward encouraging the Catholic institutions in his care to live out their mission with greater fidelity.

The Vigili Del Fuoco (firefighters) of Isola Bergamasca is a regional fire department representing 22 communities in Bergamo Province in Lombardy, Italy. Ten years ago, a sister city program was organized by Anthony Bengivenga and Giacomo Pedrini and co-sponsored with Plainfields UNICO and Terno D'Isola in Bergamo Province, Italy and at that event this regional fire department was born. - 5. All articles and captions are to be submitted in Times New Roman font. 11 point font size and in black.

- 6. Photo File Name should be identifiable to the corresponding caption.
- 7. A Chapter is allowed a maximum of six pictures per issue for a regular event.
- 8. All award recipients (ie. Scholarship, Brian Piccolo) should be included in one picture. Do not send multiple pictures from an event with one recipient per picture.
- 9. Only pictures attached to an e-mail will be accepted. Pictures embedded in an e-mail will be returned to the Chapter and not included.
- 10. All submissions should be sent to comUNICO@UNICO.org. Submissions sent to any other office e-mail address will not be included.
- 11. The deadline for submissions is 5:00 PM on the designated day.

- 12. Photos coming in after a holiday will not be included in the next issue. if deemed to be untimely. ComUNICO should reflect the current time of year.
- 13. Articles cannot contain copy righted materials. All articles must be original and completely written by the person submitting the article. An article compiled from information that was cut and pasted from other sources is considered plagiarism.

The following are ComUNICO Guidelines for a Chapter to follow:

- 1. Photos should be sent in landscape not portrait form.
- 2. Do not send in blurry pictures.
- 3. Review all submissions prior to sending for grammar and punctuation.





### MIKE DELUCIA'S LONG ROAD TO A NOVEL

Excerpts from the forward of Madness: How One Man Captivated a Nation and Started a Basketball Revolution

Sylvester Stallone has about as much to do with the resurrection of Hank Luisetti than anvone. When Rocky was released in 1976, I was a sophomore at Monsignor Scanlan High School in the Bronx, and my life's goal was to become a film actor. After high school, I enrolled in acting school in the summer of '79. After

a few years I decided to get married and go into my own business—assuming that if I were the boss I'd have control over my life. I'd have to quit acting school for a while, but I was convinced that it would all pay off in the end.

In 1983 I decided to "Stallone" and write a screenplay of my own. I shared this project with my family at the 2:00 p.m. Sunday dinner ritual. My father said he knew the perfect story. He read about a Stanford University athlete named Hank Luisetti who revolutionized basketball in the 1930s. He said, "Before Luisetti, total scores of basketball games were between 20 to 30 points, but this kid invented the layup and scored 50 or 60 points in a game." I went to the library and began the onerous task of researching a ghost.

After months of digging around, I was able to piece together a skeleton of his story. My father had most of his facts correct, except for Hank's biggest contribution. Hank Luisetti was not the originator of the layup; he perfected the running one-handed shot in an era when basketball dogma preached a stop-set-shoot mentality where players shot and passed with two hands. The game was clunky, rooted in defense, and served to fill the gap between baseball and football. Hank would change all that with his unortho-

After Luisetti's innovations, basketball gained a fan base, and this led to the advent of March Madness and the formation of the NBA. While Hank's court heroics elevated him to celebrity status, there was little information on his personal life. This was due to a lack of paparazzi, an illness he contracted during WWII, and the absence of the NBA. The man who reinvented basketball faded into obscurity.

Armed with stacks of photocopies, highlighters, pencils, paper, and a "how to write a screenplay" book, I wove together Hank's achievements with the snippets I

garnered of his personal life into the first draft of the Hank Luisetti Story. That milestone was overshadowed by maintaining a home, a business, and the addition of children. I learned that there's a huge difference between busy and "parent" busy.

Hank found its familiar place at the bottom of my "To Do" list and it remained there for decades. After selling my business, buying a new one, and nearly going bankrupt nine months later, I decided to go to college. I quit my job, became a DJ, and headed back to school. I also took a screen writing course where I developed another version of the Hank Luisetti Story.

Five years later I got a job teaching high school English in Rockland County. From 2005 to 2009, I worked seven days a week preparing lessons, creating quizzes, tests, and essays, grading papers, answering parent emails, and adapting to the ever-changing paradigms of the public education system.

In 2013 I decided to write a nonfiction book called Boycott The Yankees: A Call to Action by a Lifelong Yankees Fan. I was outraged that baseball players' greed and ego were desecrating America's favorite pastime. Going to a baseball game is no longer something fans could do as often as they wanted. Obscene ticket prices prevented a family from going to a game on a whim or kids from meeting up to take a train to the Stadium. Owners capitalize on fans because they are not organized. Boycott The Yankees is an attempt to organize. By the time I'd finished Boycott, I was ready to resurrect The Hank Luisetti Story as a young adult historical fiction novel. At that time I was calling it The Man Who Changed Basketball.

It took thirty-five years to arrive, but Madness, the story's newest title, is here to re-introduce Hank Luisetti to the world. Looking back on it now, I'm astonished that the desire to tell his story stayed alive in me for over three decades. Perhaps my stubborn personality was




responsible for it, but I'd like to think it was Hank nudging me along every time I became sidetracked—ever since that day Sylvester Stallone inspired me to write a screenplay, hold onto a dream, and see it through till the end... even if it was a million to one shot.
