

FR. ROBERT **WOLFEE**

We recently celebrated the "Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ," which was previously known by its Latin name, "Corpus Christi." It is a day set aside to celebrate, in a particularly focused way, what we celebrate and believe every time we gather at Jesus' altar for Mass. We profess the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of, and under the appearance of, bread and wine in the Eucharist.

The Eucharist is meant to unite us. That is why we call it Communion. However, at times, there might be divisions. When St. Paul wrote his first letter to the Corinthians, the community was experiencing some sharp internal division on moral, theological, ideological, and historical grounds. So, he urged them to find their source of unity in the common bread and common cup they shared in worship. He reminded them that these simple elements signaled their participation in the very body and blood of Jesus, who was the only hope for the healing of this fractured community. Only he could unite such a hopelessly splintered church, and he did! The congregation in Corinth rekindled their oneness and fellowship after St. Paul reminded them of their true center in Christ.

When we receive our Lord's body and blood, we participate in his very essence and being. So, it is important that we open our hearts, not just our mouths. In St. John's gospel, Jesus tells us that if we eat his flesh and drink his blood, we will remain in him and he in us, and that he will lead us to eternal life. The Eucharist we receive at Mass carries us throughout the week. Jesus is a steady presence, sharing in both the good times and in the struggles of our lives.

The next time we receive Jesus, let us pray for open hearts --- hearts that will know his presence in the beauty around us, in the love of family and friends, in the kindness of colleagues, and even in the challenges that we face. Let us also pray that we can truly be his presence in our world. God bless.

EVVIVA La MUSICA! I must admit that in researching the articles which I have submitted, I was not only informed but also entertained. That is especially true here, and as always, I encourage you to dig further into the topic (italiansinfonia. com); read the references ("Viaggio Musicale" is listed), listen to the ever-enjoyable voice (in English) of "Zucchero" (the Father of Italian Blues) interviewed by NPR. This interview delightfully connects the music of his background (Verdi, Puccini) with that of today (Miles Davis, Ray Charles) and his collaboration with the more modern Bono, Sting, and others.

Italy is as famous for its music as for its fine arts, evidenced by the international use of "adagio, piano" The history of Italian music is said to have begun in Florence (circa 1200), yet, a century prior, the 4-line staff was developed.

Music then continued into the 16th Century (Cinquecento) - Palestrina. Almost all types of music that exist today have their origins in the Italy of that period.

Italian Opera (Opera Lirica), in particular, although performed in many languages, was an exclusively Italian creation: ("Dafne" - Jacopo Peri - 1597," L'Orfeo" Claudio Monteverdi – 1607).

In the 18th Century (Settecento) Naples was the center of comic opera (Opera Buffa): ("La Serva Padrona "- Pergolesi – 1733; "il Matrimonio Segreto" Cimarosa - 1792); yet the most well known composer of the Napoleonic era was Alessandro Scarlatti who wrote over 100 musical compositions. During this time symphonic music was developed -("Quattro Stagioni" - Vivaldi; and by Domenico Scarlatti, son of Alessandro).

I have only referenced a few great

composers and classical works. The list continues, so I hope to have whet your appetite to research further.

In the next Issue, I will continue with the great composers of the 19th and 20th Centuries, the Italian influence on American Jazz and also on modern music and singers.

In my next column I will submit a "Trivia" matching quiz, relating songs written originally in Italian and performed in English. The results may surprise you.

Absence of Heritage Studies in U.S. Lesson Plans Prompts Education Officials to Introduce K-12 Curriculum Infusion Model

A Press Release from the Conference of Presidents of Major Italian American Organizations (of which UNICO is a member)

The Conference of Presidents of Major Italian American Organizations (COPOMIAO) is working closely with the New Jersey Italian Heritage Commission (NJIHC) on the national rollout of an equitable, diverse, and inclusive curriculum model that uses heritage as a guide to better educate U.S. students in both public and private schools. It is titled: The Universality of Italian Heritage. Through this K-12 infusion model, Italian cultural content in all subjects in grades K-12 can be integrated into a school district's existing, approved curriculum. Every lesson begins with an Italian theme then expands to incorporate the heritage of all students. COPOMIAO is inviting state commissioners/superintendents, dozens of dioceses, and Vatican officials in Rome to introduce this model to as many schools as possible. The lesson plans have been carefully designed and thoroughly tested, and they're available online at no cost at: njitalianheritage.org

"We are confident that The Universality of Italian heritage will open the door to an educationally stimulating and rewarding experience for teachers and students throughout the country," said Cav. Gilda Rorro Baldassari, Ed.D., who chairs the NJIHC Curriculum Development Committee. "Italy, through its art, philosophy, innovation and culture, heavily influenced and accelerated the development of the modern world, so it seems fitting that we use Italian heritage as a catalyst to create more enriching curricula for every student."

In addition to its lessons, the curriculum has implemented its AMICIZIA (Friendship) program. This "Gemellaggio" (twining) program takes students on a journey seldom traveled in education. It provides personal contact experiences, an international bilingual experience, and a vehicle for "piloting" new lessons through Zoom.

"This curriculum model will open the minds and perspectives of teachers and students who wish to elevate their classroom learning experiences," said COPOMIAO President Hon. Basil M. Russo. "This program will affect positive change, and right now, we need that more than ever."

Our grant funded ten (10) iPads. Said technology is utilized by the student so they can follow a daily schedule of activities with the aim of increasing independence. For example, a schedule could include a morning routine depicting the steps needed to start their day: going to their locker, hanging up their coat, using the restroom, etc. Additional schedules may involve steps required to take a shower, do laundry, or make lunch. Activities we take for granted, must be introduced in a step-by-step process with constant reinforcement.

In Memorium: Dr. Emanuele A. "Manny" Alfano



Dr. Emanuele A. "Manny" Alfano, a highly regarded Chiropractor, Educator, Civic leader, and nationally recognized leader of the Italian American community, passed away on Sunday, June 19, 2022.

In 1969 Dr. Alfano married Patricia Marinaro and raised a family in Bloomfield, New Jersey. They have three children Stephen Alfano (Tracey), Victor Alfano (Wynona), and Maria McKeon (Sean); They also have six grandchildren: Ashley, Alyssa, Stefano, Gabriella, Sienna and Christian.

A long-time musician, Manny's music career spanned over 70 years, beginning with the Italian American Feast Bands while still in high school. A long-time member of the A. F. of M, he played trumpet and was the lead singer in a variety of musical groups, including The Preludes, Brotherhood, and Unico 5.

Dr. Alfano became a member of the Bloomfield Chapter of UNICO National in February of 1980 and served as Chapter President and later District Governor of New Jersey District II. He co-founded the Belleville Chapter and together with the Bloomfield chapter of UNICO, founded the Young Italian American A.C.E.S. Club of UNICO National. He was appointed the Anti Bias Committee Chair in 1990 and served in that position for decades. Dr. Alfano, UNICO, and the ADL sponsored a television program at CUNY University on defamation and stereotyping of Italian Americans. He launched the UNICO National Italian and Italian American heritage calendar. Dr. Alfano played a key role in obtaining equal membership for women in UNICO.
